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SECTION C DESCRIPTIONS AND SPECIFICATIONS

Statement of Work

1.0 GENERAL SCOPE OF WORK

The Joint Fires and Space Applications Branch (W33) and the Gun Fire Control System (GFCS) Branch (W34), Naval Surface Warfare Center Dahlgren Division (NSWCDD) provides the Department of Defense (DoD) with unique capabilities through development projects and deliverables that directly supports the warfighter.

The contractor shall provide support to the Joint Fires and Space Applications Branch (W33) and the Gun Fire Control System (GFCS) Branch (W34), NSWCDD. The support shall include Program Support, Engineering (e.g. system engineering, requirements definition and analysis), Software Engineering, Modeling and Simulation, System Design Documents, Test and Evaluation, and Training Support. The systems supported shall include, but not be limited to, the Gun Weapon System (GWS) Mk 34 & Mk 48 and its components: Gun Computer System Mk 160, Optical Sight System Mk 46, Electro-Optical Sight System Mk 20, Gun Mounts Mk 45 & Mk 110, Naval Fires Control System (NFCS) and Battle Management System (BMS). Specific support is identified in the requirements of this SOW and shall include attendance at meetings, assimilation and analysis of requirements, plans for integration of the programs into the overall combat system, and analysis of impact to interfacing programs. Support may include travel to other sites for the purpose of meetings and test efforts. Contractor support may also be required OCONUS and potentially, in theatre (Iraq, Afghanistan). Section C.10.1 below addresses OCONUS work. The contractor shall comply with the special contract clauses and instrucitons located in Section I and Paragraph 18.0 below. The contractor shall comply with all Theater commander requirements and regulations regarding security. The Government will provide transportation of personnel and material to the deployment site unless otherwise specified.

2.0 PROGRAM SUPPORT

The contractor shall provide program support to Joint Fires and Space Applications Branch and the Gun Fire Control System Branch.

- 2.1 The contractor shall participate in the development of program planning materials and documentation. These materials may include, items such as Work Breakdown Structures, charts, schedules and calendars, and plans of action/milestones. Deliveries shall be in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 7, 8, and 9.
- 2.2 The contractor shall provide meeting support to the Program Manager and other designated staff personnel. The support shall include attendance at high-level meetings and briefings, recording of meeting activities and assigned actions items, and research and collection of data for action item completion. These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 12.
- 2.3 The contractor shall participate in high-level mission planning sessions and shall support the preparation of white papers reflecting Branch management's position on assigned tasks as requested by the sponsor. The preparation of position papers and white papers shall include research into new requirements and the collection of data from knowledgeable parties. Deliveries shall be in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 6.
- 2.4 The contractor shall develop and produce presentations in support of Program missions. This effort shall include development of viewgraph presentations, special reports, and

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seminars/tutorials in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 10.

- 2.5 The contractor shall design, develop, and maintain databases to facilitate the maintenance and tracking of program equipment, personnel, and activities. These databases, developed in customer-specified or agreed-upon applications, shall be used to produce reports of program status weekly. These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 3, 4, 5, 20, and 21.
- 2.6 The contractor shall provide program management support to Joint Fires and Space Application projects to include tracking and logistics of hardware procurement and production, supporting program managers with financial tracking and reviews of deliverables, and scheduling and tracking systems development.
- 2.7 The contractor shall perform day-to-day monitoring of program funds (issue Job Order Numbers (JON) for expenses based on Work Breakdown Structures (WBS) provided by the project manager). Update, maintain, and design modifications to the WBS funding databases. Highlight problem areas and research; make corrective action recommendations. Recommend JON assignments, restrictions, and reallocations. Monitor labor distribution and usage. Assist with Dahlgren Resource Allocation Tracking Software (DRATS) JON/WBS updates and maintenance. Assist with WBS implementation and maintenance. Assist with forecasting funding execution trends.
- 2.8 The contractor shall prepare monthly project funding profiles at the program level and WBS level. Download weekly, monthly, quarterly Corporate Data Base (CDB) Reports and populate project databases. Prepare weekly funding summary matrix, labor report, and outstanding travel and materials. Perform adhoc queries and generate adhoc reports as required. Prepare sponsor level expenditure reports monthly. Prepare WBS reports that accurately reflect project spending by task and functional areas. Draft weekly, monthly and quarterly progress reports from government provided inputs. Solicit comments and prepare final report for distribution by project manager.
- 2.9 The contractor shall provide general financial management support by processing and maintaining a repository of the following types of requests and transactions:
- Cost transfers
- Labor rejects
- Jon restrictions
- Accruals
- Funding historical files

3.0 <u>SYSTEMS ENGINEERING SUPPORT</u>

The contractor shall provide systems engineering support for new and existing systems and programs supported by the Joint Fires and Space Applications Branch the Gun Fire Control System Branch. Support shall include attendance at meetings, assimilation and analysis of requirements, plans for integration of the programs into the overall combat system, and analysis of impact to interfacing programs. The contractor shall also assist the government in developing future warfare and mission requirements based on latest technological advancements. Support may also include travel to other sites, (CONUS and OCONUS) for the purpose of meeting and test efforts. The Contractor shall comply with FAR 52.228-6 and 52.228-4. Support may also include travel to other sites for the purpose of meetings and test efforts. The contractor shall document the results of this support in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 1, 12, and 19.

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4.0 SOFTWARE ENGINEERING SUPPORT

The contractor shall provide software engineering support for the programs supported by the Joint Fires and Space Applications Branch and the Gun Fire Control System Branch. This support will have a particular emphasis in the analysis, refinement, and development of mathematical algorithms and software tools (developed in Ada, C, or other programming language as specified) for program areas (e.g. track filtering, ballistics, projectile track, and calibration). These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 2.

- 4.1 The contractor shall develop Specification Change Notices (SCNs), as appropriate, to correspond to computer program changes. SCNs shall be developed as appropriate to the System Design Documentation. Delivery of this documentation shall be in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 14 and 15.
- 4.2 The contractor shall perform engineering and data analysis, develop analysis programs, and prepare engineering reports and/or white papers as appropriate in support of analysis efforts. Delivery of the reports and papers shall be in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 1.

5.0 TECHNICAL DOCUMENTATION SUPPORT

This documentation may include a variety of reports or publications such as NSWCDD Technical Reports, Technical Notes, concept papers, or white papers. It may also include documents developed in accordance with military standards or other customer-specified formats. The documentation to be developed may cover a wide range of technologies and disciplines.

- 5.1 The contractor shall be responsible for coordinating all documentation tasks and interfacing with branch personnel principal investigators. From raw inputs (e.g. notes, background tests, tables, charts, and verbal information and instructions), the contractor shall develop finished documents in accordance with the appropriate specifications. The contractor shall deliver high quality finished reports and presentations which exactly reflect the findings and points of view of NSWCDD employees. The contractor shall implement a rigorous quality control screening of all prepared documents to ensure they are technically correct and free from errors. and shall submit these as proof copies for review by the principal investigators. Proof copies shall also be delivered for review by NSWCDD senior technical staff and managers. These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 5 items 7 and 10.
- The contractor shall develop and produce presentations in support of the systems engineering effort. This effort shall include development of viewgraph presentations, special reports, and briefings. The contractor shall provide this support by using a variety of software applications and AutoCAD techniques (e.g., engineering applications, work flow charts, and technical illustrations). The contractor shall be responsible for documentation production to include documentation design, technical typing, grammatical editing, and quality control of finished documents; and the development of documentation drawings or visuals for presentations or technical reports. These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 7 and 10.
- 5.3 The principal deliverables of the technical documentation portion of this task shall be bound copies of the final documents. In addition, a copy of all final documents developed shall be provided on magnetic media in customer-specified format. The contractor may be required to produce copies of the finished documents in quantity for distribution. These materials shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 7 and 11.

5.4 OPERATION OF GOVERNMENT VEHICLES

The contractor may be required to drive government vehicles on-site at NSWC, Dahlgren Division in the performance of duties associated with the tasking of this contract. Government provided vehicles will be used solely

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for the purposes as described in the Statement of Work and Technical Instructions of this contract. No off-base driving is authorized. All drivers shall present proof of a valid state driver's license prior to operating a government vehicle. An authorized drivers list shall be added to the Monthly Status Report and maintained by the contractor for currency. The Virginia state driver's license shall be valid for the class and weight of the vehicle which the contractor will be operating. The contractor shall submit within the preceding 30 days a Virginia Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) driving record to the Task Order Manager (TOM) for review and approval, prior to adding an individual to the Authorized Driver List. Upon notification by the TOM that an individual is approved, authority shall be granted for the immediate operation of a Government vehicle up to and including 10,000 pounds gross vehicle weight and carrying less than 15 passengers. No DUI or DWI convictions in the past 11 years will be considered. The contractor will be indemnified for insurance while operating government vehicles.

6.0 DATA MANAGEMENT SUPPORT

The contractor shall provide data management support for the engineering effort including system requirements tracing from high-level specifications through design, code, and test. Traceability shall be performed on site in Government facilities in the computer application designated by the Government. Data management support shall also include the design, development, and maintenance of other databases to facilitate the maintenance and tracking of systems engineering and program management activities. These databases, developed in customer-specified or agreed-upon applications, shall be used to produce reports of systems engineering, configuration management, and program status. Data management shall also include assistance in the development of configuration management and quality assurance plans and procedures. The contractor shall provide status accounting and shall maintain the databases for ship configuration files, system builds, and deliveries. Database reports shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 7.

7.0 COMMON OPERATING ENVIRONMENT SUPPORT

The contractor shall provide technical assistance in troubleshooting Common Operating Environment (COE) related problems and recommend architectural and systems solutions to enhance Naval Fires Control System (NFCS) operations within a COE. The contractor shall provide software design, review, analysis, prototyping, and development support for COE. Software development shall be done using public COE/Integrated Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Intelligence (C4I) System Framework (ICSF) Advanced Programming Interfaces (APIs) and assistance will be given in incorporating this software into the NFCS software baseline. The contractor shall participate in technical meetings to address NFCS issues and architecture as they are related to the COE.

8.0 SYSTEM TRAINING AND SUPPORT

The contractor shall provide technical assistance in developing training curriculum (e.g. software and documentation) and training end users how to operate NSWCDD developed systems. The contractor shall provide review, analysis, and development support for training software. The contractor shall participate in technical meetings to address training issues and architecture as they are related to the overall training program. The contractor shall provide troubleshooting support as required on-site for deployed systems. The contractor shall investigate problems and recommend architectural and systems solutions to enhance system operations within the training environment.

9.0 GLOBAL POSITIONING SYSTEM (GPS) SYSTEM INTEGRATION

9.1 The contractor shall assist NSWCDD staff in the integration and testing of a real-time GPS system for accurate navigation. There are two main software components in this system. The contractor shall ready the real-time data processing and navigation component for operational testing. NSWCDD will provide the data gathering and transmission software, the overall system control software, including a data latency management capability. The contractor shall ensure that his data processing component executes after integration with the NSWCDD component. To this

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end, the contractor shall work closely with NSWCDD personnel in charge of the NSWCDD component, both in the testing, trouble-shooting, planning of software modifications, and implementation of such modifications in his component. The data processing component shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 20 and 21.

- 9.2 The contractor shall include features and make modifications to the data processing component, to make operations in real time more reliable and precise. This work shall be mainly to improve data editing features now in place. It shall include improving the editing of cycle slips, particularly under conditions of high ionospheric scintillation, such as those that often occur in the tropics.
- 9.3 The contractor shall provide basic documentation of the data processing and navigation component, as part of the documentation of the overall system. Documentation shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 7.
- The contractor shall investigate possible enhancements that may be implemented in future tasks. These might include (a) extrapolating fixed-site data to fill in gaps due to outages and editing (b) the use of reference sites from the differential GPS base stations augmented with a sparse global network to refine the broadcast GPS orbits, producing more precise, often updated ephemerides and clock corrections (similar to what is planned for GPS III), in support of precise real-time navigation; (c) the use of inertial sensors' data to assist GPS data editing, provide precise navigation at a high rate, and provide attitude information to correct phase-windup in the rover; (d) the use of the new, three-frequency GPS signals of the modernized GPS; (e) the use of ionospheric corrections, transmitted as part of the messaging between the ground network and the rover, in order to fix carrier-phase ambiguities and greatly speed up the convergence of the navigation filter; (f) changes that might be made to the real-time navigation software, to obtain a precise, point-positioning procedure for long-range navigation. Recommendations on the feasibility and reports of the estimated navigation improvement of incorporating such enhancements to the system will be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 items 2, 5 and 7.

10.0 TRAVEL REQUIREMENTS

13.0 SECURITY.

Secret in accordance with the DD254.

Electronic spillages (ES) are unacceptable and pose a risk to national security. An electronic spillage is defined as classified data placed on an information system (IS), media or hardcopy document possessing insufficient security controls to protect the data at the required classification level, thus posing a risk to national security (e.g., sensitive compartmented information (SCI) onto collateral, Secret onto Unclassified, etc). The contractor's performance as it relates to ES will be evaluated by the Government. ES reflects on the overall security posture of NSWCDD and a lack of attention to detail with regard to the handling of classified information of IS security discipline and will be reflected in the contractor's performance rating. In the event that a contractor is determined to be responsible for an ES, all direct and indirect costs incurred by the Government for ES remediation will be charged to the contractor.

14.0 PROGRESS REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

Monthly Technical and Financial Status Reports are required and shall include the following:

Technical: Accomplishments for the month, meetings attended, problems encountered, deliverables, documentation, status of key personnel, and work planned for the next reporting period. Technical Status Reports shall be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 23.

Financial: Funding Status to document hours/dollars ordered, planned, funded, expended in the current period, expended to date and remaining on the task. Financial reports will be delivered in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 22.

The contractor shall prepare and deliver monthly financial reports in accordance with Attachment J.1 item 22.

16.0 IN-PROCESS REVIEWS

The contractor shall conduct In-Proces Reviews (IPR's) with the Government. The reviews are estimated to take place on a semi-annual basis, but shall be scheduled as needed with TOM.

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17.0 PRE-DEPLOYMENT REQUIREMENTS

- 17.1 Synchronized Predeployment and Operational Tracker
- (a) In accordance with DoD Instruction 3020.41, Contractor Personnel Authorized to Accompany the U.S. Armed Forces, the Contractor shall enter before deployment, or if already in the designated operational area, enter upon becoming an employee under contract, and maintain current data, including departure data, for all Contractor personnel that are authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States as specified in paragraph (b)(1) of this clause. The automated web-based system to use for this effort is the Synchronized Predeployment and Operational Tracker (SPOT) (For information on how to register and enter data into this system, go to https://spot.altess.army.mil/privacy.aspx).
- (b) The Contractor shall ensure that all employees on the list have a current DD Form 93, Record of Emergency Data Card, on file with both the Contractor and the designated Government official. The Contracting Officer will inform the Contactor of the Government official designated to receive this data card.
- 17.2 The contractor shall develop and maintain a deployment plan and checklist for personnel who shall deploy in support of contingency operations. The contractor shall certify that deploying contractor personnel have completed the applicable administrative requirements set forth in the Mobilization Checklist applicable to the respective service, Contractors Deployment Checklist. DA Form 7425 Readiness and Deployment Checklist for Army and/or CRC Form 1 Mobilization Checklist, rev S for the Marine Corps.
- 17.3 The Government will provide assistance to insure the contractor can meet deployment requirements for things such as visa and medical support. Satellite phones, cell phones, smart phones or PDAs shall be provided by the contractor as necessary. The contractor will be equitably reimbursed in accordance with the contract. Vehicles, shelters, transportation, and power generating equipment will be provided by the Government as needed. The contractor shall obtain medical and dental exams as per Medical Exam Form DD2808 and Dental Exam Form DD2813.
- 17.4 The contractor shall process Common Access Card (CAC) applications for its employees and subcontractor employees in accordance with FAR 52.204-9, Personal Identity Verification of Contractor Personnel. The contractor shall provide USCENTCOM Theater of Operations Civilian Personnel Data Verification Card.
- 17.5 The contractor shall obtain a sponsored military email account for each applicant including its subcontractors to be deployed.
- 17.6 The contractor shall brief its employees regarding the potential danger, stress, physical hardships, and field living conditions. The contractor shall require all its employees to acknowledge in writing that they understand the danger, stress, physical hardships, and field living conditions that are possible if the employee deploys in support of a contingency deployment involving military operations.
- 17.7 The contractor shall designate a point of contact for all of its plans and operations. The contractor shall prepare plans for support of military operations in-country, as required, or as directed by the Government.
- 17.8 The contractor shall submit Call Forward Request and attend one week readiness and training within 30 days of deployment Ft. Benning for Army and/or Camp Lejeune for USMC. Army registration can be found at https://www.benning.army.mil/CRC/. All USMC individuals being deployed must first submit all of the required Deployment paperwork in the form of their Deployment Package.

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This package is routed from the Contract Company to the Government Authority (GA) and then on to the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations (DCSOPS), for endorsement. Upon endorsement by the DCSOPS, a copy will be provided back to the respective GA, and the CRC will ensure that the individual is added to the Deployment Processing Center (DPC) attendance roster and added to the Personnel Forecast (for deployments to CENTCOM AOR); the CRC will also add individuals to the Personnel Database, at this time. Contractors must make an appointment for processing.

18.0 REQUIRED CLAUSES

52.2 HOSTAGE REPORTING

The local hostage reporting instruction shall be used for all construction and service contracts.

- 3. The Contracting Officer will notify the Joint Contracting Commander-Iraq/Afghanistan (J3) of a contractor kidnapping.

52.3 DEFENSE CONTRACTORS OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES

All Contractors in the Multi-National Forces-Iraq (MNF-I) theater of operations shall comply with and shall ensure that their personnel supporting MNF-I forces are familiar with and comply with all applicable orders, directives, and instructions issued by the MNF-I Commander relating to force protection and safety. Contractors shall provide an initial report of all weapons firing incidents to the Reconstruction Operations Center (ROC) as soon as practical based upon the situation and submit a written report to a ROC within 48 hours. The initial report will include the name of the company, where the incident occurred, time when the incident occurred, a brief description of the events

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leading up to the incident, and a point of contact for the company. A follow-up, comprehensive written report of events surrounding the firing of weapons will be provided to the ROC within 96 hours. Reports shall be submitted to the ROC, Operations Section (or as otherwise directed: DSN 318-239-4301, VOIP 703-544-1370, MCI 914-822-5302, IRENA 07902-7762300, Thurman 8821621157354, and IMMERSED 870764061257. Contractors will also provide first aid and request MEDEVAC of injured persons, and remain available for Coalition response forces based upon the situation. In the event contractor personnel are detained by US or Coalition Forces, prolonged detention due to lack of proper identification can be alleviated by contractor personnel possessing on their person information that includes the Contractors name, the contract number, a POC in the Contractor management, and the phone number of the ROC.

52.5 TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS

Trafficking in Persons Prohibition Prohibition Against Human Trafficking, Inhumane Living Conditions, and Withholding of Employee Passports

All contractors ("contractors" herein below includes subcontractors at all tiers) are reminded of the prohibition contained in Title 18, United States Code, Section 1592, against knowingly destroying, concealing, removing, confiscating, or possessing any actual or purported passport or other immigration document, or any other actual or purported government identification document, of another person, to prevent or restrict or to attempt to prevent or restrict, without lawful authority, the person's liberty to move or travel, in order to maintain the labor or services of that person, when the person is or has been a victim of a severe form of trafficking in persons.

Title 22, United States Code, Section 7102, defines "severe forms of trafficking in persons" as "the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services, through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery."

All contractors are reminded of the provisions of Title 22, United States Code, Section 7104(g), that requires the President of the United States to ensure that any contract entered into by a Federal department or agency with a contractor, shall include a condition authorizing the department or agency to terminate the contract, without penalty to the United States Government, if the contractor or any subcontractor (i) engages in severe forms of trafficking in persons, or (ii) uses forced labor in the performance of the contract.

BASED UPON THIS AUTHORITY, THIS CONTRACT MAY BE TERMINATED BY THE GOVERNMENT, WITHOUT PENALTY TO THE GOVERNMENT, IF THE CONTRACTOR, OR ANY OF ITS SUBCONTRACTORS AT ANY TIER, ENGAGES IN SEVERE FORMS OF TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS, OR, USES FORCED LABOR IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THE CONTRACT. "WITHOUT PENALTY" MEANS THAT THE CONTRACT MAY BE TERMINATED FOR DEFAULT/CAUSE. THIS PROVISION DOES NOT JUST APPLY TO CASES OF WITHHOLDING PASSPORTS, BUT TO ANY AND ALL FORMS OF HUMAN TRAFFICKING, PROPAGATION OF INHUMANE LIVING CONDITIONS, AND VIOLATION OF ANY OF THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SPECIAL CONTRACT REQUIREMENT. VIOLATION OF THESE PROVISIONS WILL ALSO SUBJECT OFFENDING CONTRACTORS TO SUSPENSION, DEBARMENT, AND BEING BANNED FROM GOVERNMENT INSTALLATIONS.

Discussion of particular laws and statutes does not relieve the contractor from complying with all applicable laws and statutes, whether mentioned in this contract or not, including all United States laws and regulations on severe forms of trafficking in persons, procurement of commercial sex acts, and use of forced labor which may apply to its employees' conduct in the host nation, and those laws for which jurisdiction is established by the Military Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Act of 2000 (18 USC 3261-3267) and 18 USC 3271, Trafficking in Persons Offenses Committed by Persons

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Employed by or Accompanying the Federal Government Outside the United States.

Contractors are also required to comply with the following provisions:

- 1) Contractors shall only hold employee passports and other identification documents discussed above for the shortest period of time reasonable for administrative processing purposes.
- 2) Contractors shall provide all employees with a signed copy of their employment contract, in English as well as the employee's native language that defines the terms of their employment/compensation.
- 3) Contractors shall not utilize unlicensed recruiting firms, or firms that charge illegal recruiting fees.
- 4) Contractors shall be required to provide adequate living conditions (sanitation, health, safety, living space) for their employees. Fifty square feet is the minimum acceptable square footage of personal living space per employee. Upon contractor's written request, contracting officers may grant a waiver in writing in cases where the existing square footage is within 20% of the minimum, and the overall conditions are determined by the contracting officer to be acceptable. A copy of the waiver approval shall be maintained at the respective life support area.
- 5) Contractors shall incorporate checks of life support areas to ensure compliance with the requirements of this Trafficking in Persons Prohibition into their Quality Control program, which will be reviewed within the Government's Quality Assurance process.
- 6) Contractors shall comply with international laws regarding transit/exit/entry procedures, and the requirements for work visas. Contractors shall follow all Host Country entry and exit requirements.

Contractors have an affirmative duty to advise the Contracting Officer if they learn of their employees violating the human trafficking and inhumane living conditions provisions contained herein. Contractors are advised that contracting officers and/or their representatives will conduct random checks to ensure contractors and subcontractors at all tiers are adhering to the law on human trafficking, humane living conditions and withholding of passports.

The contractor agrees to incorporate the substance of this clause, including this paragraph, in all subcontracts under his contract.

52.6 ARMING OF CONTRACTORS

Arming Requirements and Procedures for Private Security Company (PSC) Contracts, Personal Security Detachment (PSD) Contracts, and for Requests for Personal Protection in Iraq and Afghanistan

- a. General. Contractor and its subcontractors at all tiers that require arming under this contract agree to obey all existing and future laws, regulations, orders, and directives applicable to the use of private security personnel in Iraq and Afghanistan, including US CENTCOM, Multi-National Force Commander and Multi-National Corps Commander orders, instructions and directives. Contractors will ensure that all employees, including employees at any tier of subcontracting relationships, armed under the provisions of this contract, comply with the contents of this clause and with the requirements set forth in the following:
- (1) DODI 3020.41, Contractor Personnel Authorized to Accompany the US Armed Forces;
- (2) DFARS 252.225-7040, Contractor Personnel Supporting a Force Deployed Outside the United States;

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- (3) CPA Order #17, Registration Requirements for Private Security Companies, dated 24 Jun 04;
- (4) US CENTCOM Policy Letter, Personal Protection and Contract Security Service Arming, dated 23 Dec 05
- b. Required Government Documentation. The unit requesting the contractor security shall provide a description of the following to the arming approval authority and to the contracting officer:
- (1) The specific location where the PSC will operate;
- (2) The persons and/or property that require protection;
 - (3) The anticipated threat;
 - (4) The required weapon types; and
- (5) The reason current security/police forces are inadequate.
- c. Required Contractor Documentation. Contractors and their subcontractors at all tiers that require arming approval shall provide the following to the contracting officer representative (COR):
- (1) Documentation that each employee who will be armed under the contract received the following training:
- (A) Weapons Qualification/Familiarization. All employees must meet the qualification requirements established by any DoD or other U.S. government agency
 - (B) Law of Armed Conflict (LOAC);
- (C) Rules for the Use of Force (RUF), as defined in the US CENTCOM Policy, dated 23 December 2005; and
- (D) Distinction between the above-prescribed RUF and the Rules of Engagement (ROE), which are applicable only to military forces.
- (2) Completed DD Form 2760 (or equivalent documentation) for each armed employee, indicating that the employee is not otherwise prohibited under U.S. law from possessing the required weapon or ammunition.
- (3) One (1) copy of a business license from the Iraqi Ministry of Trade;
- (4) One (1) copy of an operating license (or a temporary operating license) from the Ministry of Interior:
- (5) A communications plan that, at a minimum, sets forth the following:
- (A) The contractor's method of notifying military forces and requesting assistance where hostilities arise or combat action is needed;
- (B) How relevant threat information will be shared between contractor security personnel and U.S. military forces; and
- (C) How the contractor will coordinate transportation with appropriate military
- (6) An acceptable plan for accomplishing background checks on all contractor and subcontractor employees who will be armed under the contract. The contractor shall, at a minimum, perform the following (which will be specifically addressed in its plan and which will be documented and furnished to the COR upon completion):

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- (A) Use one or more of the following sources when conducting the background checks: Interpol, FBI, Country of Origin Criminal Records, Country of Origin US Embassy Information Request, CIA records, and/or any other records available;
- (B) Verify with MNC-I Provost Marshal that no employee has been barred by any commander within Iraq; and
- (C) Certify, after completing all checks, that all persons armed under this contract are not prohibited under U.S. law from possessing a weapon or ammunition.
- d. Required Contractor Acknowledgements. Contractors and their subcontractors at all tiers that require arming approval will provide written acknowledgement of the following to the COR:
- (1) Penalties for Non-Compliance. Failure of contractor or subcontractor employee(s) to comply with the laws, regulations, orders, and rules (including those specified herein) governing the use of force may result in the revocation of weapons authorization for such employee(s). Where appropriate, such failure may also result in the total revocation of weapons authorization for the contractor (or subcontractor) and sanctions under the contract, including termination.
- (2) Criminal and Civil Liability. Arming of contractor or subcontractor employees under this contract may subject the contractor, its subcontractors, and persons employed by the same, to U.S. and Host Nation prosecution and civil liability. "Host Nation" refers to the nation or nations where services under this contract are performed.
- (3) Lapses in Training. Failure to successfully retrain an employee who is armed under this contract within twelve (12) months of the last training date will constitute a lapse in the employee's authorization to possess and carry the weapon. All unauthorized employees will immediately surrender their weapon to the contractor and will remain unarmed until such time as they are retrained and the COR determines that the retraining is sufficient.
- e. Authorized Weapon & Ammunition Types. Unless DCDRUSCENTCOM (or a designee) provides otherwise, all arming requests and authorizations for contractor or subcontractor employees under this contract shall be limited to U.S. Government-approved weapons and ammunition. This restriction applies to all weapons in the possession of contractor employees, even if such weapons are required for personal protection. The following weapons and ammunition are currently authorized by the U.S. Government for use in Iraq and Afghanistan:
- (1) The M9, M4, M16, or equivalent (e.g. .45 CAL, AK-47).
- (2) The M9 or equivalent sidearm will be the standard personal protection weapon unless other weapons are specifically requested and approved.
- (3) US government Ball ammunition is the standard approved ammunition.
- f. Requirements for Individual Weapons Possession. All employees of the contractor and its subcontractors at all tiers who are armed under this contract must:
- (1) Possess only those U.S. Government-approved weapons and ammunition for which they are qualified under the training requirements of section (c);
- (2) Carry weapons only when on duty or at a specific post;
- (3) Not conceal any weapons, unless specifically authorized;
- (4) Carry proof of authorization to be armed. Employees not possessing such proof will be deemed unauthorized and must surrender their weapon to their employer; and

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- (5) Not consume any alcoholic beverage while armed or within eight (8) hours of the next work period where they will be armed.
- g. Weapons/Equipment Restrictions and Responsibilities. Unless otherwise provided, the U.S. Government will not provide any weapons or ammunition to contractors, their subcontractors, or any employees of the same. The Contractor will provide all weapons and ammunition to those employees that will be armed under the contract. The contractor and its subcontractors at all tiers will also provide interceptor body armor, ballistic helmets, and the Nuclear, Biological, and Chemical (NBC) protective masks to those employees that require such equipment in the performance of their duties.
- h. Rules for the Use of Force (RUF). In addition to the RUF and ROE training referenced in paragraph (c), the contractor and its subcontractors at all tiers will monitor and report all activities of its armed employees that may violate the RUF. Prompt reporting demonstrates a desire by the contractor and its subcontractors to minimize the impact of any violations and, therefore, will be given favorable consideration. Violations of the RUF include, though are not limited to:
- (1) Taking a direct part in hostilities or combat actions, other than to exercise self-defense;
- (2) Failing to cooperate with Coalition and Host Nation forces;
- (3) Using deadly force, other than in self-defense where there is a reasonable belief of imminent risk of death or serious bodily harm;
 - (4) Failing to use a graduated force approach;
 - (5) Failing to treat the local civilians with humanity or respect; and
- (6) Detaining local civilians, other than in self-defense or as reflected in the contract terms.
- i. Retention and Review of Records. The Contractor and all subcontractors at all tiers shall maintain records on weapons training, LOAC, RUF and the screening of employees for at least six (6) months following the expiration (or termination) of the contract. The Contractor and its subcontractors at all tiers shall make these records available to the Contracting Officer or designated representative, at no additional cost to the government, within 72 hours of a request.
- j. Contractor Vehicles. Vehicles used by contractor and subcontractor personnel in the course of their security duties shall not be painted or marked to resemble US/Coalition or host nation military and police force vehicles.
- k. Quarterly Reporting. The prime contractor will report quarterly (i.e. NLT 1 January, 1 April, 1 July and 1 October for each quarter of the calendar year) to the Contracting Officer responsible for this contract, and any other organization designated by the Contracting Officer, the following information under this contract:
- (1) The total number of armed civilians and contractors;
- (2) The names and contact information of its subcontractors at all tiers; and
- (3) A general assessment of the threat conditions, adequacy of force numbers, and any problems that might require a change to force levels. Note: this information is in addition to the information the contractor promises to immediately provide under the communications plan referenced at paragraph (c)(5).

Final Guidance:

Summary of Contractor Requirements:

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- (1) Logistics Information Requirements Form
- (2) Reconstruction Levy Exemption
- (3) Cargo Placards

It is the contractor's responsibility to provide all the requested information mentioned above including the use of the identified cargo placards in sufficient time to allow for required delivery. Failure to comply with these instructions may result in a delay of the goods and materials being shipped from arriving at their final destination. Delays resulting from failure to follow the above steps may be assigned as the contractor's responsibility.

52.11 MEDICAL/DENTAL CARE

In accordance with military directives (DoDI 3020.41, DoDI 6000.11, CFC FRAGO 09-1038, DoD PGI 225.74), resuscitative care, stabilization, hospitalization at Level III (emergency) military treatment facilities, and assistance with patient movement in emergencies where loss of life, limb or eyesight could occur will be provided. Hospitalization will be limited to emergency stabilization and short-term medical treatment with an emphasis on return to duty or placement in the patient movement system (DoD Instruction 6000.11). All costs associated with any treatment and transportation of personnel to the selected civilian facility are reimbursable to the Government. Routine and primary medical care is not authorized. Pharmaceutical services are not authorized for routine or known, routine prescription drug needs of the individual. Contractor personnel must deploy with sufficient amounts of prescription medication for the entire length of deployment or have arrangements for additional medications as needed. Routine dental care, examinations and cleanings are not authorized. Emergency dental (i.e., broken teeth or lost fillings) may be provided, but only to the extent the medical facility can support. When it benefits the Government, the medical facility may provide care beyond these provisions, but the contractor must obtain the approval of the contracting officer. Notwithstanding any other provision of the contract, the contractor shall be liable for any and all medically-related services rendered.

The contractor bears the responsibility for ensuring all employees (and subcontractor employees) are aware and comply with these provisions. This is a flow-down requirement that must be included in subcontracts at any tier. The contractor shall ensure that all individuals complete requisite medical and dental screening. If it is determined after arrival that the employee is unfit (or has any of the disqualifying conditions listed in Enclosure 3 of DoDI 3020.41), the contractor will be required to remove the employee and return him/her to the United States and to ensure that his/her function is replaced by a qualified individual at no expense to the Government.

SENSITIVE, PROPRIETARY, AND PERSONAL INFORMATION

Work under this contact may require that personnel have access to Privacy Information. Contractor personnel shall adhere to the Privacy Act, Title 5 of the U.S. Code. Section 552a and applicable agency rules and regulations. Access to and preparation of sensitive information subject to privacy Act and Business Sensitive safeguarding and destruction may be required in the execution of tasking associated with this contract. Administratively sensitive information/data must not be shared outside of the specific work areas. All personnel with access to privacy act data in support of this contract must sign a privacy act certification.

DIGITAL DELIVERY OF DATA

(a) Delivery by the Contractor to the Government of certain technical data and other data is now frequently required in digital form rather than as hard copy. Such delivery may causeconfusion between data rights and computer software rights. It is agreed that, to the extent that any such data

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is computer software by virtue of its delivery in digital form, the Government will be licensed to use that digital-form data with exactly the same rights and limitations as if the data had been delivered as hard copy.

(b) Any limited rights legends or other allowed legends placed by a Contractor on technical data or other data delivered in digital form shall be digitally included on the same media as the digital-form data and must be associated with the corresponding digital-form technical data to which the legends apply to the extent possible. Such legends shall also be placed in humanreadable form on a visible surface of the media carrying the digital-form data as delivered, to the extent possible.

DdI-C30 HAZARDOUS MATERIALS USED ON GOVERNMENT SITE

- (a) This clause applies if hazardous materials are utilized at any time during the performance of work on a Government site under this order. Hazardous materials are defined in FederalStandard No. 313 and include items such as chemicals, paint, thinners, cleaning fluids, alcohol, epoxy, flammable solvents, or asbestos.
- (b) The contractor shall have an active Hazard Communication Program in place for all contractor employees per 29 C.F.R. 1910.1200. The above requirement shall be made a part of the standard employee facility clearance procedures for all separated personnel. For involuntarily separated personnel and those separated under adverse circumstances, the contractor shall notify NSWCDD Physical Security in advance of the date, time and location where the NSWCDD representative may physically remove the employee's automobile bumper sticker and retrieve the NSWCDD badge prior to the employee departing the contractor's facility. CONTROL OF CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL

All persons engaged in work while on Government property shall be subject to search of their persons (no bodily search) and vehicles at any time by the Government, and shall report any known or suspected security violations to the appropriate Security Department. Assignment, transfer, and reassignment of Contractor personnel shall be at the discretion of the Contractor. However, when the Government directs, the Contractor shall remove from contract performance any person who endangers life, property, or national security through improper conduct. This list shall be updated within forty eight hours after changes occur.

IDENTIFICATION BADGES

The Contractor shall be required to obtain identification badges from the Government for Contractor personnel to be located on Government property. The identification badge shall be visible at all

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times while employees are on Government property. The Contractor shall furnish all requested information required to facilitate issuance of identification badges and shall conform to applicable regulations concerning the use and possession of the badges. The Contractor shall be responsible for ensuring that all identification badges issued to Contractor employees are returned to the appropriate Security Department within forty eight hours following the completion of the contract, relocation or termination of an employee, and upon request by the Contracting Officer.

NON-PERSONAL SERVICES

The Government will neither supervise contractor employees nor control the method by which the contractor performs the required tasks. Under no circumstances shall the Government assign tasks to, or prepare work schedules for individual contractor employees. It shall be the responsibility of the contractor to manage its employees and to guard against any actions that are of the nature of personal services, or give the perception of personal services. If the contractor feels that any actions constitute, or are perceived to constitute personal services, it shall be the contractor's responsibility to notify the Contracting Officer immediately. These services shall not be used to perform work of a policy/decision making or management nature, i.e., inherently Governmental functions. All decisions relative to programs supported by the contractor shall be the sole responsibility of the Government.

Except in special circumstances explicitly detailed elsewhere in this document, the Contractor shall provide IS resources needed in the performance of this contract. This includes, but is not limited to, computers, software, networks, and addresses.

Contractor Use of NSWCDD IS Resources

In the event that the contractor is required to have access to NSWCDD IS resources, the login name (common id) and associated information shall be registered with the NSWCDD site issuing authority. If the contractor requires access to applications/systems that utilize public key (PK) cryptography, the contractor is responsible for obtaining requisite PK certificates from a DOD or External Certificate Authority.

If this contract requires that the contractor be granted access and use of NSWCDD IS resources (at any site), the IS shall be accredited for contractor use in accordance with procedures specified by the Information Assurance Office. The accreditation shall include TOM certification that the use and access is required by this contract.

"Person" as usedherein includes Corporations, Partnerships, Joint Ventures, and other business enterprises.
- (b) The Contractor warrants that to the best of its knowledge and belief, and except as otherwise set forth in the contract, the Contractor does not have any organizational conflict of interest(s) as defined in paragraph (a).
- (c) It is recognized that the effort to be performed by the Contractor under this contract may create a potential organizational conflict of interest on the instant contract or on a future acquisition. In order to avoid this potential conflict of interest, and at the same time to avoid prejudicing the best interest of the Government, the right of the Contractor to participate in future procurement of equipment and/or services that are the subject of any work under this contract shall be limited as described below in accordance with the requirements of FAR 9.5.

- (g) Notwithstanding paragraph (f) above, if the Contractor was aware, or should have been aware, of an organizational conflict of interest prior to the award of this contract or becomes, orshould become, aware of an organizational conflict of interest after award of this contract and does not make an immediate and full disclosure in writing to the Contracting Officer, the Government may terminate this contract for default.
- (h) If the Contractor takes any action prohibited by this requirement or fails to take action required by this requirement, the Government may terminate this contract for default.
- (i) The Contracting Officer's decision as to the existence or nonexistence of an actual or potential

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organizational conflict of interest shall be final.

- (j) Nothing in this requirement is intended to prohibit or preclude the Contractor from marketing or selling to the United States Government its product lines in existence on the effectivedate of this contract; nor, shall this requirement preclude the Contractor from participating in any research and development or delivering any design development model or prototype of any such equipment. Additionally, sale of catalog or standard commercial items are exempt from this requirement.
- (k) The Contractor shall promptly notify the Contracting Officer, in writing, if it has been tasked to evaluate or advise the Government concerning its own products or activities or those of acompetitor in order to ensure proper safeguards exist to guarantee objectivity and to protect the Government's interest.

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

Uncompensated effort is defined as hours provided by personnel in excess of 40 hours per week without additional compensation for such excess work. Total Time Accounting (TTA) effort is included in this definition. All other effort is defined as compensated effort. If no effort is indicated in the above table, uncompensated/ TTA effort performed by the Contractor shall not be counted in fulfillment of the level of effort obligations under this contract. (c) Effort performed in fulfilling the total level of effort obligations specified above shall only include effort performed in direct support of this contract and shall not include time and effort expended on such things as (local travel to and from an employee's usual work location), uncompensated effort while on travel status, truncated lunch periods, work (actual or inferred) at an employee's residence or other non-work locations (except as provided in paragraph (j) below), or other time and effort which does not have a specific and direct contribution to the tasks described in Sections B aND c.
- (d) The level of effort for this contract shall be expended at an average rate of approximately (to be completed at time of award) hours per week. It is understood and agreed that the rate of man-hours per month may fluctuate in pursuit of the technical objective, provided such fluctuation does not result in the use of the total man-hours of effort prior to the expiration of the term hereof, except as provided in the following paragraph.
- (e) If, during the term hereof, the Contractor finds it necessary to accelerate the expenditure of

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direct labor to such an extent that the total man hours of effort specified above would be used prior to the expiration of the term, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing setting forth the acceleration required, the probable benefits which would result, and an offer to undertake the acceleration at no increase in the estimated cost or fee together with an offer, setting forth a proposed level of effort, cost breakdown, and proposed fee, for continuation of the work until expiration of the term hereof. The offer shall provide that the work proposed will be subject to the terms and conditions of this contract and any additions or changes required by then current law, regulations, or directives, and that the offer, with a written notice of acceptance by the Contracting Officer, shall constitute a binding contract. The Contractor shall not accelerate any effort until receipt of such written approval by the Contracting Officer. Any agreement to accelerate will be formalized by contract modification.

- (f) The Contracting Officer may, by written order, direct the Contractor to accelerate the expenditure of direct labor such that the total man hours of effort specified in paragraph (a) above would be used prior to the expiration of the term. This order shall specify the acceleration required and the resulting revised term. The Contractor shall acknowledge this order within five days of receipt.
- (g) If the total level of effort specified in paragraph (a) above is not provided by the Contractor during the period of this contract, the Contracting Officer, at its sole discretion, shall either (i) reduce the fee of this contract as follows:

Fee Reduction = Fee X (Required LOE - Expended LOE)

Required LOE

or (ii) subject to the provisions of the clause of this contract entitled "LIMITATION OF COST" (FAR 52.232-20) or "LIMITATION OF COST (FACILITIES)" (FAR 52.232-21), as applicable, require the Contractor to continue to perform the work until the total number of man hours of direct labor specified in paragraph (a) above shall have been expended, at no increase in the fee of this contract.

- (h) The Contractor shall provide and maintain an accounting system, acceptable to the Administrative Contracting Officer and the Defense Contract Audit Agency (DCAA), which collects costs incurred and effort (compensated and uncompensated, if any) provided in fulfillment of the level of effort obligations of this contract. The Contractor shall indicate on each invoice the total level of effort claimed during the period covered by the invoice, separately identifying compensated effort and uncompensated effort, if any.
- (i) Within 45 days after completion of the work under each separately identified period of performance hereunder, the Contractor shall submit the following information in writing to the Contracting Officer with copies to the cognizant Contract Administration Office and to the DCAA office to which vouchers are submitted: (1) the total number of man hours of direct labor expended during the applicable period; (2) a breakdown of this total showing the number of man hours expended in each direct labor classification and associated direct and indirect costs; (3) a breakdown of other costs incurred; and (4) the Contractor's estimate of the total allowable cost incurred under the contract for the period. Within 45 days after completion of the work under the contract, the Contractor shall submit, in addition, in the case of a cost underrun; (5) the amount by which the estimated cost of this contract may be reduced to recover excess funds and, in the case of an underrun in hours specified as the total level of effort; and (6) a calculation of the appropriate fee reduction in accordance with this clause. All submissions shall include subcontractor information.
- (j) Unless the Contracting Officer determines that alternative worksite arrangements are detrimental to contract performance, the Contractor may perform up to 10% of the hours at an alternative worksite, provided the Contractor has a company-approved alternative worksite plan. The primary worksite is the traditional "main office" worksite. An alternative worksite means an employee's residence or a telecommuting center. A telecommuting center is a

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geographically convenient office setting as an alternative to an employee's main office. The Government reserves the right to review the Contractor's alternative worksite plan. In the event performance becomes unacceptable, the Contractor will be prohibited from counting the hours performed at the alternative worksite in fulfilling the total level of effort obligations of the contract. Regardless of the work location, all contract terms and conditions, including security requirements and labor laws, remain in effect. The Government shall not incur any additional cost nor provide additional equipment for contract performance as a result of the Contractor's election to implement an alternative worksite plan.

(k)Notwithstanding any of the provisions in the above paragraphs, the Contractor may furnish man hours up to five percent in excess of the total man hours specified in paragraph (a) above, provided that the additional effort is furnished within the term hereof, and provided further that no increase in the estimated cost or fee is required.

PAYMENT OF FEE(S) (LEVEL OF EFFORT) (NAVSEA 1993)

- (a) For purposes of this delivery order, "fee" means "target fee" in cost-plus-incentive-fee type contracts, "base fee" in cost-plus-award-fee type contracts, or "fixed fee" in cost-plus-fixed-fee for level of effort type delivery orders.
- (b) The Government shall make payments to the Contractor, subject to and in accordance with the clause in this contract entitled "FIXED FEE" (FAR 52.216-8) or "INCENTIVE FEE", (FAR 52.216-10), as applicable. Such payments shall be equal to (to be provide at time of award/option exercise) percent of the allowable cost of each invoice submitted by and payable to the Contractor pursuant to the clause of this contract entitled "ALLOWABLE COST AND PAYMENT" (FAR 52.216-7), subject to the withholding terms and conditions of the "FIXED FEE" or "INCENTIVE FEE" clause, as applicable (percentage of fee is based on fee dollars divided by estimated cost dollars, including facilities capital cost of money). Total fee(s) paid to the Contractor shall not exceed the fee amount(s) set forth in this contract.
- (c) The fee(s) specified in SECTION B, and payment thereof, is subject to adjustment pursuant to paragraph (g) of the special contract requirement entitled "LEVEL OF EFFORT". If the fee(s) is reduced and the reduced fee(s) is less than the sum of all fee payments made to the Contractor under this contract, the Contractor shall repay the excess amount to the Government. If the final adjusted fee exceeds all fee payments made to the contractor under this contract, the Contractor shall be paid the additional amount, subject to the availability of funds. In no event shall the Government be required to pay the Contractor any amount in excess of the funds obligated under this contract at the time of the discontinuance of work.
- (d) Fee(s) withheld pursuant to the terms and conditions of this contract shall not be paid until the contract has been modified to reduce the fee(s) in accordance with the "FINALIZED FIXED FEE" special contract requirement, or until the Procuring Contracting Officer has advised the paying office in writing that no fee adjustment is required.

INSTRUCTIONS REGARDING INVOICING OF FIXED FEE DURING PERFORMANCE

- (a) Subparagraph (b) of the clause entitled "PAYMENT OF FEES (LEVEL OF EFFORT) above states that fixed fee payments shall be equal to the percentages of the SLINs in SECTION B, of the allowable cost of each invoice. The contractor shall use that rate to invoice fixed fee. This rate could vary by Task Order period (Base Period, Option 1, etc.).
- (b) The clause entitled "ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS" in this Section provides the cumulative amount funded. Separate amounts are provided for Estimated Cost and Fixed Fee. - (b) Reimbursable travel costs included only that travel performed from the Contractor's facility to the worksite, in and around the worksite, and from the worksite to the Contractor's facility.
- (c) Relocation costs and travel costs incident to relocation are allowable to the extent provided in FAR 31.205-35; however, Contracting Officer approval shall be required prior to incurring relocation expenses and travel costs incident to the relocation.

The contractor shall, to the maximum extent practicable, minimize overall travel costs by taking advantage of discounted airfare rates available thru advance purchase. (b) Training

IT includes computers, ancillary equipment, software, firmware and similar products, services (including support services), and related resources for both unclassified and classified applications.

(d) The requirements of the above clause apply equally to subcontractors and consultants.

No substitution shall Be made without prior notification to and concurrence of the Contracting Officer in accordance with this requirement.
- (b) The contractor agrees that during the first 90 days of the period of performance no key personnel substitutions will be permitted unless such substitutions are necessitated by an individual's sudden illness, death, or termination of employment. All proposed substitutions shall have qualifications equal to or higher than the qualifications of the person to be replaced. The Contracting Officer shall be notified in writing of any proposed substitution at least fifteen (15) days, or ninety (30) days if a security clearance is to be obtained,in advance of the proposed substitution. Such notification shall include:
- (1) An explanation of the circumstances necessitating the substitution;
- (2) A complete resume of the proposed substitute;
- (3) The hourly rates of the incumbent and the proposed substitute; and
- (4) Any other information requested by the Contracting Officer to enable him/her to judge whether or not the Contractor is maintaining the same high quality of personnel that provided the partial basis for award.
- (c) The Contracting Officer shall also receive written notification if no substitution is being requested. This notification shall include (1) the name of the initial person proposed; and (2) the reasons why the individual is not being made available to perform under the task order to the extent proposed.
- (d) In the event a requirement to increase the specified level of effort for a designated labor category, but not the overall level of effort of the contract, occurs, the Contractor shall submit to the Contracting Officer a written request for approval to add personnel to the designated labor category. The same information as specified in paragraph (b) above is to be submitted with the request.
- (e) The Contracting Officer shall evaluate requests for changes in personnel and promptly notify the Contractor, in writing, whether the request is approved or disapproved.

KEY PERSONNEL - POST AWARD ADMINISTRATION

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- (a) Resumes for growth in a Key category will not be accepted unless the originally-proposed Key Personnel is/are working on the Task Order to the extent proposed.
- (b) Upon contract award, the desired qualifications as stated herein, will become minimum qualifications for any growth in Key Personnel categories beyond those individuals originally proposed.

Ddl-H13 POST AWARD CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL APPROVAL

- (a) Requests for post award approval of additional or replacement key personnel shall be submitted via email. E-mail submissions shall be made simultaneously to the Contract Specialist and the TOM/ATOM. Electronic notification via e-mail from the Contract Specialist will serve as written approval/disapproval on behalf of the Contracting Officer. This approval is required before an individual may begin charging to the Task Order.
- (b) It is desired that resumes be submitted in the format required in solicitation Section H for original proposal submission. Work experience shall be presented in separate paragraphs, clearly marked with proper category of experience (Qualifying Experience; Non-Relevant Experience -- If relevant and non-relevant experience was obtained while at the same employer, separate time periods shall be noted for each assignment.) All qualifying experience shall be presented in a level of detail that will permit the evaluator to make a clear connection between the experience and the stated qualifications for the labor category. Specific examples of work assignments, accomplishments, and products shall be provided. Phrases such as "assisted with", "participated in", or "supported" are unacceptable except as introductory to a detailed description of the actual work performed. In addition, the resume for the Project Manager shall list previous contracts or tasks under which he/she had technical and management responsibility including contract number and customer point of contact.

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All military experience claimed shall be described such that each tour is treated as a separate employer. Time frames/titles/ responsibilities shall be provided at the level of detail prescribed by above. Military experience not documented in this manner may not be considered.

Contractors shall avoid gaps in experience as time unaccounted for may lead to rejection of the resume.

The cut-off date for any experience claimed shall be the date the resume is submitted.

Sea 5252.242-9115 TECHNICAL INSTRUCITONS (Apr 1999)

- (a) Performance of the work hereunder shall be subject to written technical instructions issued electronically by the Contract Specialist on behalf of the Contracting Officer. As used herein, technical instructions are defined to include the following
- (1) Directions to the Contractor which suggest pursuit of certain lines of inquiry, shift work emphasis, fill in details or otherwise serve to accomplish the contractual statement of work.
- (2) Guidelines to the Contractor which assist in the interpretation of drawings, specifications or technical portions of work description.
- (b) Technical instructions must be within the general scope of work stated in the order. Technical instructions may not be used to: (1) assign additional work under the order; (2) direct a change as defined in the "CHANGES" clause of the basic contract; (3) increase or decrease the estimated order amount (including fee), as applicable, the level of effort, or the time required for performance; or (4) change any of the terms, conditions or specifications of the order.
- (c) If, in the opinion of the Contractor, any technical instruction calls for effort outside the scope of the order or is inconsistent with this requirement, the Contractor shall notify the Contracting Officer in writing within ten (10) working days after the receipt of any such instruction. The Contractor shall not proceed with the work affected by the technical instruction unless and until the Contractor is notified by the Contracting Officer that the technical instruction is within the scope of this order.
- (d) Nothing in the foregoing paragraph shall be construed to excuse the Contractor from performing that portion of the order work statement which is not affected by the disputed technical instruction.

MATERIAL: The cost of materials furnished pursuant to specific authorization by the Contracting Officer shall be reimbursed at the Company's invoice cost, less any discounts to be taken plus applicable DCAA approved burden rate(s). No fee will be allowed on material cost.SAVINGS INITIATIVES

SAVINGS INTIATIVES

The following cost savings initiatives are required under this Task Order.

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The above maximum rates are applicable to the prime contractor. If subcontracting is proposed, the prime contractor is strongly encouraged to restrict subcontractor fixed fee to the lower of (a) the prime contractor's fee under this order, or (b) the subcontractor's SeaPort-e fixed fee rate where the subcontractor is also a prime contractor under SeaPort-e. The purpose of this is the Government's desire to avoid having it be more financially lucrative for a firm to be a subcontractor rather than a prime contractor under SeaPort-e. The Government strongly encourages the prime contractor to also implement this under Time and Materials subcontracts. Subcontractors may not earn fee on ODC's regardless of the pricing arrangement of the subcontract.

The Government also strongly encourages the prime contractor to eliminate "double pass-thru" costs by (1) avoiding second tier subcontractors/consultants during performance and (2) where this situation is unavoidable, limiting subcontractor pass-thru costs to the lower of (a) the prime contractor's pass-thru rate under this order or (b) the subcontractor's SeaPort-e pass-thru rate where the subcontractor is also a prime contractor under SeaPort-e.

52.217-9 OPTION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE CONTRACT (MAR 2000) (NAVSEA VARIATION)

- (a) The Government may extend the term of this task order by written notice to the Contractor within the time periods specified in Section B, provided that the Government gives the Contractor a preliminary written notice of its intent to extend at least 30 days before the task order expires. This preliminary notice does not commit the Government to an extension.
- (b) If the Government exercises this option, the extended task order shall be considered to include this option clause.

52.222-2 -- PAYMENT FOR OVERTIME PREMIUMS (JUL 1990)

- (a) The use of overtime is authorized under this contract if the overtime premium does not exceed \$0* or the overtime premium is paid for work --
- (1) Necessary to cope with emergencies such as those resulting from accidents, natural disasters, breakdowns of production equipment, or occasional production bottlenecks of a sporadic nature;

- (1) Identify the work unit; e.g., department or section in which the requested overtime will be used, together with present workload, staffing, and other data of the affected unit sufficient to permit the Contracting Officer to evaluate the necessity for the overtime;
- (2) Demonstrate the effect that denial of the request will have on the contract delivery or performance schedule;
- (3) Identify the extent to which approval of overtime would affect the performance or payments in connection with other Government contracts, together with identification of each affected contract; and
- (4) Provide reasons why the required work cannot be performed by using multishift operations or by employing additional personnel.

52.244-2 SUBCONTRACTS (AUG 1998); ALTERNATE 1 (JAN 2006)

Paragraph (k) from the basic contract is completed as follows for this order:

(k) Paragraphs (d) and (f) of this clause do not apply to the following subcontracts, which were evaluated during negitiations:

The Contracting Officer's consent to a subcontract does not constitue a determination of the acceptability of the

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subcontract terms or price, or of the alloability of the costs.

SUBCONTRACTORS/CONSULTANTS

- (a) In addition to the information required by FAR 52.244-2(f)(1)(vii) above, the contractor shall include the following information in requests to add subcontractors or consultants during performance, regardless of subcontract type or pricing arrangement. These requirements apply to all subcontracts/consulting agreements where labor hour performed will be counted against the requirements of the Level of Effort clause in Section G of the Task Order.
- (1) A copy of the proposed subcontractors cost or price proposal.
- (2) The results of negotiations to incorporate rate caps no higher than the lower of (i) SeaPort-e rate caps for the prime contractor, or in the case where the proposed subcontractor is also a SeaPort-e prime, (ii) rate caps that are no higher than the subcontractor's prime SeaPort-e contract.
- (3) Detailed justifications to include second-tier subcontracting to other subcontractors or consultants to include a rationale why these additional firms or consultants could not be obtained by subcontracts or consulting agreements with the prime contractor.
- (b) The Government strongly discourages T&M or Labor Hour pricing arrangements because the contractor has little incentive to manage their labor force effectively or to control ODC costs. However, this type of pricing arrangement is permitted as long as the proposed subcontractor has a DCAA approved accounting system. In these instances, the contractor shall provide specific justification for negotiating subcontracts with this pricing arrangement. The prime contractor is strongly encouraged to ensure that any fee rate incorporated into the negotiated labor rate(s) does not exceed SeaPort-e limitations. In the case of subcontracts with T&M or Labor Hour pricing arrangements, also identify specific additional surveillance/controls to be employed by the prime contractor to ensure that efficient performance methods are being employed.

252.225-7040 CONTRACTOR PERSONNEL AUTHORIZED TO ACCOMPANY U.S. ARMED FORCES DEPLOYED OUTSIDE THE UNITED STATES (JUN 2011)

(a) Definitions. As used in this clause--Combatant Commander means the commander of a unified or specified combatant command established in accordance with 10 U.S.C. 161.

Designated operational area means a geographic area designated by the combatant commander or subordinate joint force commander for the conduct or support of specified military operations.

Law of war means that part of international law that regulates the conduct of armed hostilities. The law of war encompasses all international law for the conduct of hostilities binding on the United States or its individual citizens, including treaties and international agreements to which the United States is a party, and applicable customary international law.

Subordinate joint force commander means a sub-unified commander or joint task force commander.

- (b) General.
- (1) This clause applies when Contractor personnel are authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States in--
- (i) Contingency operations;
- (ii) Humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or
- (iii) Other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander.

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- (2) Contract performance in support of U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States may require work in dangerous or austere conditions. Except as otherwise provided in the contract, the Contractor accepts the risks associated with required contract performance in such operations.
- (3) Contractor personnel are civilians accompanying the U.S. Armed Forces.
- (i) Except as provided in paragraph (b)(3)(ii) of this clause, Contractor personnel are only authorized to use deadly force in self-defense.
- (ii) Contractor personnel performing security functions are also authorized to use deadly force when such force reasonably appears necessary to execute their security mission to protect assets/persons, consistent with the terms and conditions contained in their contract or with their job description and terms of employment.
- (iii) Unless immune from host nation jurisdiction by virtue of an international agreement or international law, inappropriate use of force by contractor personnel authorized to accompany the U.S. Armed Forces can subject such personnel to United States or host nation prosecution and civil liability (see paragraphs (d) and (j)(3) of this clause).
- (4) Service performed by Contractor personnel subject to this clause is not active duty or service under 38 U.S.C. 106 note.
- (c) Support. (1)(i) The Combatant Commander will develop a security plan for protection of Contractor personnel in locations where there is not sufficient or legitimate civil authority, when the Combatant Commander decides it is in the interests of the Government to provide security because--
- (A) The Contractor cannot obtain effective security services;
- (B) Effective security services are unavailable at a reasonable cost; or
- (C) Threat conditions necessitate security through military means.
- (ii) The Contracting Officer shall include in the contract the level of protection to be provided to Contractor personnel.
- (iii) In appropriate cases, the Combatant Commander may provide security through military means, commensurate with the level of security provided DoD civilians.
- (2)(i) Generally, all Contractor personnel authorized to accompany the U.S. Armed Forces in the designated operational area are authorized to receive resuscitative care, stabilization, hospitalization at level III military treatment facilities, and assistance with patient movement in emergencies where loss of life, limb, or eyesight could occur. Hospitalization will be limited to stabilization and short-term medical treatment with an emphasis on return to duty or placement in the patient movement system.
- (ii) When the Government provides medical treatment or transportation of Contractor personnel to a selected civilian facility, the Contractor shall ensure that the Government is reimbursed for any costs associated with such treatment or transportation.
- (iii) Medical or dental care beyond this standard is not authorized unless specified elsewhere in this contract.
- (3) Unless specified elsewhere in this contract, the Contractor is responsible for all other support required for its personnel engaged in the designated operational area under this contract.
- (4) Contractor personnel must have a Synchronized Predeployment and Operational Tracker (SPOT)-generated letter of authorization signed by the Contracting Officer in order to process through a deployment center or to travel to, from, or within the designated operational area. The letter of authorization also will identify any additional authorizations, privileges, or Government support that Contractor personnel are entitled to under this contract.
- (d) Compliance with laws and regulations. (1) The Contractor shall comply with, and shall ensure that its personnel

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authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States as specified in paragraph (b)(1) of this clause are familiar with and comply with, all applicable--

- (i) United States, host country, and third country national laws;
- (ii) Provisions of the law of war, as well as any other applicable treaties and international agreements;
- (iii) United States regulations, directives, instructions, policies, and procedures; and
- (iv) Orders, directives, and instructions issued by the Combatant Commander, including those relating to force protection, security, health, safety, or relations and interaction with local nationals.
- (2) The Contractor shall institute and implement an effective program to prevent violations of the law of war by its employees and subcontractors, including law of war training in accordance with paragraph (e)(1)(vii) of this clause.
- (3) The Contractor shall ensure that contractor employees accompanying U.S. Armed Forces are aware-
- (i) Of the DoD definition of ``sexual assault" in DoDD 6495.01, Sexual Assault Prevention and Response Program;
- (ii) That many of the offenses addressed by the definition are covered under the Uniform Code of Military Justice (see paragraph (e)(2)(iv) of this clause); and
- (iii) That the offenses not covered by the Uniform Code of Military Justice may nevertheless have consequences to the contractor employees (see paragraph (h)(1) of this clause).
- (e) Pre-deployment requirements.
- (1) The Contractor shall ensure that the following requirements are met prior to deploying personnel authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces. Specific requirements for each category may be specified in the statement of work or elsewhere in the contract.
- (i) All required security and background checks are complete and acceptable.
- (ii) All deploying personnel meet the minimum medical screening requirements and have received all required immunizations as specified in the contract. The Government will provide, at no cost to the Contractor, any theater-specific immunizations and/or medications not available to the general public.
- (iii) Deploying personnel have all necessary passports, visas, and other documents required to enter and exit a designated operational area and have a Geneva Conventions identification card, or other appropriate DoD identity credential, from the deployment center. Any Common Access Card issued to deploying personnel shall contain the access permissions allowed by the letter of authorization issued in accordance with paragraph (c)(4) of this clause.
- (iv) Special area, country, and theater clearance is obtained for personnel. Clearance requirements are in DoD Directive 4500.54, Official Temporary Duty Abroad, and DoD 4500.54-G, DoD Foreign Clearance Guide. Contractor personnel are considered non-DoD personnel traveling under DoD sponsorship.
- (v) All personnel have received personal security training. At a minimum, the training shall--
- (A) Cover safety and security issues facing employees overseas;
- (B) Identify safety and security contingency planning activities; and
- (C) Identify ways to utilize safety and security personnel and other resources appropriately.
- (vi) All personnel have received isolated personnel training, if specified in the contract, in accordance with DoD Instruction 1300.23, Isolated Personnel Training for DoD Civilian and Contractors.
- (vii) Personnel have received law of war training as follows:

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- (A) Basic training is required for all Contractor personnel authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States. The basic training will be provided through--
- (1) A military-run training center; or
- (2) A Web-based source, if specified in the contract or approved by the Contracting Officer.
- (B) Advanced training, commensurate with their duties and responsibilities, may be required for some Contractor personnel as specified in the contract.
- (2) The Contractor shall notify all personnel who are not a host country national, or who are not ordinarily resident in the host country, that--
- (i) Such employees, and dependents residing with such employees, who engage in conduct outside the United States that would constitute an offense punishable by imprisonment for more than one year if the conduct had been engaged in within the special maritime and territorial jurisdiction of the United States, may potentially be subject to the criminal jurisdiction of the United States in accordance with the Military Extraterritorial Jurisdiction Act of 2000 (18 U.S.C. 3621, et seq.);
- (ii) Pursuant to the War Crimes Act (18 U.S.C. 2441), Federal criminal jurisdiction also extends to conduct that is determined to constitute a war crime when committed by a civilian national of the United States;
- (iii) Other laws may provide for prosecution of U.S. nationals who commit offenses on the premises of U.S. diplomatic, consular, military or other U.S. Government missions outside the United States (18 U.S.C. 7(9)); and
- (iv) In time of declared war or a contingency operation, Contractor personnel authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces in the field are subject to the jurisdiction of the Uniform Code of Military Justice under 10 U.S.C. 802(a)(10).
- (f) Processing and departure points. Deployed Contractor personnel shall--
- (1) Process through the deployment center designated in the contract, or as otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer, prior to deploying. The deployment center will conduct deployment processing to ensure visibility and accountability of Contractor personnel and to ensure that all deployment requirements are met, including the requirements specified in paragraph (e)(1) of this clause;
- (2) Use the point of departure and transportation mode directed by the Contracting Officer; and
- (3) Process through a Joint Reception Center (JRC) upon arrival at the deployed location. The JRC will validate personnel accountability, ensure that specific designated operational area entrance requirements are met, and brief Contractor personnel on theater-specific policies and procedures.
- (g) Personnel data.
- (1) The Contractor shall enter before deployment and maintain data for all Contractor personnel that are authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the United States as specified in paragraph (b)(1) of this clause. The Contractor shall use the Synchronized Predeployment and Operational Tracker (SPOT) web-based system, at http://www.dod.mil/bta/products/spot.html, to enter and maintain the data.
- (2) The Contractor shall ensure that all employees in the database have a current DD Form 93, Record of Emergency Data Card, on file with both the Contractor and the designated Government official. The Contracting Officer will inform the Contractor of the Government official designated to receive this data card.
- (h) Contractor personnel.
- (1) The Contracting Officer may direct the Contractor, at its own expense, to remove and replace any Contractor personnel who jeopardize or interfere with mission accomplishment or who fail to comply with or violate applicable

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requirements of this contract. Such action may be taken at the Government's discretion without prejudice to its rights under any other provision of this contract, including the Termination for Default clause.

- (2) The Contractor shall have a plan on file showing how the Contractor would replace employees who are unavailable for deployment or who need to be replaced during deployment. The Contractor shall keep this plan current and shall provide a copy to the Contracting Officer upon request. The plan shall--
- (i) Identify all personnel who are subject to military mobilization;
- (ii) Detail how the position would be filled if the individual were mobilized; and
- (iii) Identify all personnel who occupy a position that the Contracting Officer has designated as mission essential.
- (3) Contractor personnel shall report to the Combatant Commander or a designee, or through other channels such as the military police, a judge advocate, or an inspector general, any suspected or alleged conduct for which there is credible information that such conduct--
- (i) Constitutes violation of the law of war; or
- (ii) Occurred during any other military operations and would constitute a violation of the law of war if it occurred during an armed conflict.
- (i) Military clothing and protective equipment.
- (1) Contractor personnel are prohibited from wearing military clothing unless specifically authorized in writing by the Combatant Commander. If authorized to wear military clothing, Contractor personnel must-
- (i) Wear distinctive patches, arm bands, nametags, or headgear, in order to be distinguishable from military personnel, consistent with force protection measures; and
- (ii) Carry the written authorization with them at all times.
- (2) Contractor personnel may wear military-unique organizational clothing and individual equipment (OCIE) required for safety and security, such as ballistic, nuclear, biological, or chemical protective equipment.
- (3) The deployment center, or the Combatant Commander, shall issue OCIE and shall provide training, if necessary, to ensure the safety and security of Contractor personnel.
- (4) The Contractor shall ensure that all issued OCIE is returned to the point of issue, unless otherwise directed by the Contracting Officer.
- (j) Weapons.
- (1) If the Contractor requests that its personnel performing in the designated operational area be authorized to carry weapons, the request shall be made through the Contracting Officer to the Combatant Commander, in accordance with DoD Instruction 3020.41, paragraph 6.3.4.1 or, if the contract is for security services, paragraph 6.3.5.3. The Combatant Commander will determine whether to authorize in-theater Contractor personnel to carry weapons and what weapons and ammunition will be allowed.
- (2) If the Contracting Officer, subject to the approval of the Combatant Commander, authorizes the carrying of weapons--
- (i) The Contracting Officer may authorize the Contractor to issue Contractor-owned weapons and ammunition to specified employees; or
- (ii) The may issue Government-furnished weapons and ammunition to the Contractor for issuance to specified Contractor employees.

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- (3) The Contractor shall ensure that its personnel who are authorized to carry weapons-
- (i) Are adequately trained to carry and use them--
- (A) Safely;
- (B) With full understanding of, and adherence to, the rules of the use of force issued by the Combatant Commander; and
- (C) In compliance with applicable agency policies, agreements, rules, regulations, and other applicable law;
- (ii) Are not barred from possession of a firearm by 18 U.S.C. 922; and
- (iii) Adhere to all guidance and orders issued by the Combatant Commander regarding possession, use, safety, and accountability of weapons and ammunition.
- (4) Whether or not weapons are Government-furnished, all liability for the use of any weapon by Contractor personnel rests solely with the Contractor and the Contractor employee using such weapon.
- (5) Upon redeployment or revocation by the Combatant Commander of the Contractor's authorization to issue firearms, the Contractor shall ensure that all Government-issued weapons and unexpended ammunition are returned as directed by the Contracting Officer.
- (k) Vehicle or equipment licenses. Contractor personnel shall possess the required licenses to operate all vehicles or equipment necessary to perform the contract in the designated operational area.
- (1) Purchase of scarce goods and services. If the Combatant Commander has established an organization for the designated operational area whose function is to determine that certain items are scarce goods or services, the Contractor shall coordinate with that organization local purchases of goods and services designated as scarce, in accordance with instructions provided by the Contracting Officer.
- (m) Evacuation.
- (1) If the Combatant Commander orders a mandatory evacuation of some or all personnel, the Government will provide assistance, to the extent available, to United States and third country national Contractor personnel.
- (2) In the event of a non-mandatory evacuation order, unless authorized in writing by the Contracting Officer, the Contractor shall maintain personnel on location sufficient to meet obligations under this contract.
- (n) Next of kin notification and personnel recovery.
- (1) The Contractor shall be responsible for notification of the employee-designated next of kin in the event an employee dies, requires evacuation due to an injury, or is isolated, missing, detained, captured, or abducted.
- (2) In the case of isolated, missing, detained, captured, or abducted Contractor personnel, the Government will assist in personnel recovery actions in accordance with DoD Directive 3002.01E, Personnel Recovery in the Department of Defense.
- (o) Mortuary affairs. Mortuary affairs for Contractor personnel who die while accompanying the U.S. Armed Forces will be handled in accordance with DoD Directive 1300.22, Mortuary Affairs Policy.
- (p) Changes. In addition to the changes otherwise authorized by the Changes clause of this contract, the Contracting Officer may, at any time, by written order identified as a change order, make changes in the place of performance or Government-furnished facilities, equipment, material, services, or site. Any change order issued in accordance with this paragraph (p) shall be subject to the provisions of the Changes clause of this contract.
- (q) Subcontracts. The Contractor shall incorporate the substance of this clause, including this paragraph (q), in all subcontracts when subcontractor personnel are authorized to accompany U.S. Armed Forces deployed outside the

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United States in--

- (1) Contingency operations;
- (2) Humanitarian or peacekeeping operations; or
- (3) Other military operations or military exercises, when designated by the Combatant Commander.

- (a) The Contractor is required to exercise due diligence to ensure that none of the funds received under this contract are provided, directly or indirectly, to a person or entity who is actively supporting an insurgency or otherwise actively opposing U.S. or coalition forces in a contingency operation.
- (b) The Head of the Contracting Activity (HCA) has the authority to—
- (1) Terminate this contract for default, in whole or in part, if the HCA determines in writing that the Contractor failed to exercise due diligence as required by paragraph (a) of this clause; or
- (2) Void this contract, in whole or in part, if the HCA determines in writing that any funds received under this Contract have been provided, directly or indirectly, to a person or entity who is actively supporting an insurgency or otherwise actively opposing U.S. or coalition forces in a contingency operation.

252.225-7994 ADDITIONAL ACCESS TO CONTRACTOR AND SUBCONTRACTOR RECORDS IN THE UNITED STATES CENTRAL COMMAND THEATER OF OPERATIONS (DEVIATION 2012-00005)(JAN 2012)

- (a) In addition to any other existing examination-of-records authority, the Department of Defense is authorized to examine any records of the Contractor to the extent necessary to ensure that funds available under this Contract are not—
- (1) Subject to extortion or corruption; or
- (2) Provided, directly or indirectly, to persons or entities that are actively supporting an insurgency or otherwise actively opposing United States or coalition forces in a contingency operation.
- (b) The substance of this clause, including this paragraph (b), is required to be included in subcontracts under this Contract that have an estimated value over \$100,000.
